Baccalaureate Degree Requirements

Semester Hours Required

A minimum of 120 semester hours and 45 upper-division semester hours (300 and 400 level) courses are required for a bachelor's degree.

First Year Composition Requirement

Students must demonstrate reasonable proficiency in written English by achieving a grade of "C" or better in both ENG 101 and 102 or in ENG 105 or their equivalents. Should a student receive a grade lower than "C" in any of the courses, it must be repeated until the specified proficiency is demonstrated.

General Studies Requirements

All undergraduate students in the College of Public Programs are required to complete the university General Studies requirements in order to be eligible for graduation in any of the undergraduate curricula offered by the college. **Many general studies requirements may simultaneously fulfill major requirements (see shaded regions).**

Interdisciplinary Public Service Requirement (freshman only)

One approved course from each course prefix is required.

Limitation on Physical Education Activity Hours

No more than eight hours of physical education activity courses may be counted within the minimum 120 hours required for graduation.

Pass/Fail Option

The College of Public Programs does not offer any courses for pass/fail credit. Courses completed for pass/fail credit outside the College of Public Programs may count only as elective credit in meeting degree requirements.

Bachelor of Social Work

The mission of the School of Social Work is to prepare ethical and effective social workers and scholars who become leaders in the promotion of social justice, engage in best practices in the delivery of human services, contribute to shaping more just social policies, and devote their careers to finding the most effective means of serving those in need. The School emphasizes life-long learning, evidence-based practice, and understanding and respect for the unique social, political and cultural diversity of the Southwest.

The BSW program is divided into the pre-professional program for freshman and sophomore students and the professional program for juniors and seniors. During the first two years students concentrate on obtaining a strong background in liberal arts and sciences and may take electives in related areas. Upon admission to the professional program, students focus on social work practice, human behavior in the social environment and field instruction in community agencies.

Admission to the Professional Program
Students may apply for admission to the professional program after completing:

- A minimum of 56 semester hours with a cumulative GPA of at least 2.00 at ASU;
- ENG 101 and 102 or equivalent (grade of "C" or better);
- The University math requirement: College Mathematics or higher;
- The following core social work classes with a 2.75 minimum GPA and a minimum grade of "C" in each: SWU 171, 291, 295, 303 & 310; and
- A minimum of 60 hours of experience in human services (completed as part of the course requirements for SWU 291).
